I.Introduction

St. Anthony's is an II-18 Roman Catholic academy for girls serving the community within the City of Sunderland. There are c. 1340 pupils in the school with a buoyant sixth form of c. 340 pupils. There are c.100 teaching staff (full time and part time) and c. 70 support and administration staff (some full time and many part time).

The vast majority of the students and staff are from the R.C. faith tradition, given the ethos of the school, but applications are invited from girls of other faiths and none. The wide catchment area, which covers the whole of the City of Sunderland, provides a genuinely comprehensive intake. Pupils attending the school come from very varied backgrounds. Many parents in neighbouring authorities seek to have their daughters educated at the academy due to its inclusive nature.

2. History and ethos

The school was founded by the Sisters of Mercy during the 19th century and has a fundamental commitment to high quality education for girls. The academy is supported in its work by three Chaplains. The Chaplaincy Office is situated adjacent to the School Chapel which is often the venue for retreat days, opportunities for reflection and many smaller scale liturgical activities. In 2004 the school celebrated its centenary as a secondary school with sixth form. The school has one hundred years experience as a provider of Sixth Form education for girls. 3. Location and site

The school is situated in the centre of Sunderland within walking distance of train, metro and bus stations. It has a garden site consisting of three Victorian villas and a series of more modern buildings. Gabriel House and Somerleyton House have been refurbished as designated Sixth Form areas. A new purpose built Music, Creative Arts and RE facility, McAuley House was opened December 2010 (a total of 6 new spaces) and McAuley phase 2 was completed summer 3013 providing additional classroom and ICT facilities (a total of 8 new spaces) including a high tech. Educare Centre. The remainder of the school site is currently being developed (completion summer 2016), as part of the EFA's N.E. Capital Batch 2 Priority Schools Building Project.

5. Behaviour and attendance

Expectations with regard to pupil behaviour are high and the pastoral care of pupils is a strength. In the 2013 OfSTED rated behaviour as **Outstanding** and the 2007 OfSTED stated the behaviour of students was decribed as "**Exemplary**". One of only two schools in the North East to achieve **outstanding** for behaviour in 2007. Attendance is routinely 95% and punctuality is excellent and highly valued.

6. Curriculum, examinations and entrance into the world of work or higher education

The school sets high academic standards and has a strong commitment to the delivery of a broad and balanced curriculum. Twenty seven subjects are offered at GCSE and thirty six at Advanced level.

Routinely a small number of the most able students are offered Oxbridge places and between a quarter and a third of students in the last three years have obtained places at either either Russell Group or the most prestigious Scottish Universities requiring straight A grades and a large number of A*/A grades at A level.



Retention rates are usually c.90% and entry to Higher Education has been between 80-90% routinely during the last decade.

7. Extended/extra-curricular activities

Pupils also enjoy a wide range of extra-curricular activities (there are over one hundred and fifty groups and individual meetings each week ranging from Ski Club with an attendance of up to eighty to small one to one groups). Many girls and teams perform in sports at national and international level. There are very high participation rates in sporting and other extended curricular activities.

Over 500 educational visits have taken place during the last three years ranging from voluntary work in Swaziland, to Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme to local and national History visits.

An extensive summer school programme, specialising in Technology, for students transferring from Y6 and KS3 pupils which takes place during the first week of the summer holidays each year.

Pupils are encouraged to be active citizens and take part in local events, charitable fund raising and volunteering as well as competing in local and national competitions.

The thriving Music department has undertaken Music tours (Prague 2007, Dublin 2008, Cracow 2009, Rome 2010, Paris 2011, Oxford, Blenheim, Highclere and Magdalen College 2012, Venice and Verona 2013, Salzburg (2014) and Paris (2015). In 2013 the department presented a highly successful production of, "Joseph" (2013) "Oliver" (2014), "Into the Woods" (2015) and "Calamity Jane" planned for 2016.
