Sttevei Atalla – Pilot Officer Sttevei Atalla was honoured with the Queen's commendation for valuable service as a "model for stabilising a complex area" in Helmand Province through diplomacy. She was praised as "invaluable" in her role as a Military Stabilisation Support Team (MSST) Operator, in which she led negotiations with key local elders and helped to connect the population to the new Afghanistan government and the national police force. The local community named Sttevei “Guwette” (Desert Flower).

Maxine Baker – Visiting Senior Tutor in the Documentary Department of the National Film and Television School (UK). She produced documentaries for Channel 4, the Scottish Arts Council, Granada TV and also independently. Maxine was Director/Chief Executive of the Scottish Film Council and Head of Documentaries and Commissioning Editor for Factual Programmes at Scottish Television.

Ruth-Ann Boyle - The Brit Awards “Song of the Year” award winner in 1996 with, “You’re not Alone” with the band, “Olive”.

Andrea O’Cain – Associate Dean of Law Northumbria University.

Bridget Dolan QC – Barrister of the Year 2015. Leading Practitioner in the Court of Protection and Coroner’s Courts. Specialist in the inter-face between law and psychiatry.

Denise Egan (staff alumna) – England Netball Assistant Coach, team achieved two Bronze medals in the Commonwealth Games and a Gold medal in the European Championships, 2002 Coach of the Year and carrier of the Olympic Torch 2012 when it toured the country.

Helen Emes – Counsel to the Deputy Speaker of the House of Commons.

Bishop Helen-Ann Hartley – Anglican bishop and academic and the Bishop of Ripon since 2018. She previously served as Bishop of Waikato, New Zealand, from 2014 to 2017. She was the first woman to have trained as an Anglican

priest to join the episcopate and the third woman to become a bishop of the Anglican Church in Aotearoa, New Zealand and Polynesia.

Catherine Jacob – journalist for Channel 4 News, ITV News and % News and later Reporter for ITV News. From 2010 she would become a freelance news correspondent for Sky News. She is the youngest journalist to be awarded the Golden Nymph for Best News Story at the Monte Carlo film and TV awards for an investigation into child labour in Bangladesh.

Pam Jackson –2010 City of London Woman of Achievement Award winner. CEO of Level 20 (2019). Advisor to the private equity industry for over 35 years. She started her career at Thornton Baker in 1977 as a Chartered Accountant and a Chartered Tax Adviser. She joined what is now PwC in 1983 and spent 36 years with them, 29 as a Partner. Service on the Executive Board of PwC Middle East and on the governance boards of PwC UK and PwC Middle East. She has also set up PwC Female Partners and Directors network in 2001. She recently completed her International Director Programme at Insead.

Nominated for Outstanding Costumes for a Series (1999 The West Wing), Outstanding Individual Achievement in Costuming for a Miniseries or a Special (1991 Homefront), Costume Designer of the Year (Scandal 2015), Outstanding Contemporary Television Series (2015 and 2014 Scandal), Outstanding Contemporary Television Series (2001 The West Wing).
