Activities

Summer school 2021 was a great success, with over 100 Year 6 students attending the transition activities over the course of the first 5 days of the summer holidays. The students took part in a range of activities based in the Technology , Art and PE departments. These Year 6 students were helped in the activities by students from a range of year groups ranging from Year 7 to 12

Product design: Students worked in the workshops to create a mobile phone holder/ pencil pot, using a wide variety of hand tools and decorative techniques

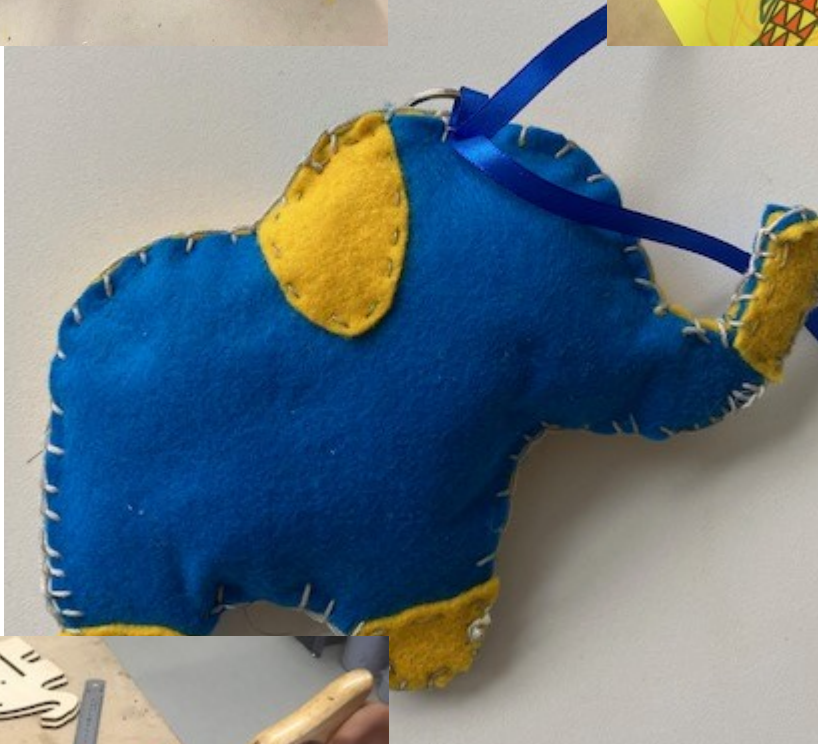
Textiles: Students created small soft toys, drawing out their own patterns, cutting and stitching the felt, before using surface decoration and embroidery techniques to decorate their toys.

Art: Students learned how to create block prints, creating a range of prints which were then put together in a montage to be used in the chapel during Year 7 celebrations.

PE: Students took part in a variety of team sports and individual activities, which varied depending on the weather.

We also had a small group of Y7 and Y8 students who took part in a range of academic and enrichment activities. These students had Numeracy and Literacy sessions, as well as Music, Art, Science and PE sessions. Students performed experiments in Science, played the keyboards and performed simple pieces in Music, and played team and individual sports in PE.
