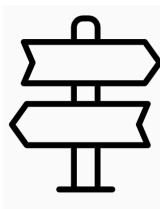


MFL Curriculum Map FCSE Programme



In MFL we aim to develop language skills in a variety of contexts and encourage a greater knowledge and understanding of grammar. Our courses encourage an imaginative and creative use of the foreign language and offers insight into the culture of where the language is spoken. FCSE Theme 4 Unit 8 Pupils will study birthdays and weddings including details about gifts. Various festivals including fireworks, mother's day, Easter, New Year, Hallowe'en, Pancake Day, Christmas and St Valentine's Day will be covered. Opinions will be expressed. We will look at arties and things to bring, carnivals and other Hispanic festivals. Finally we will study end of exams and ways of celebrating.



Final Exams and Cultural Projects

Pupils ensure exam portfolio is complete and work to deepen their knowledge through projects which look at topics in greater detail e.g. designing a town. There is also the opportunity to expand their knowledge through cultural study e.g. projects based around Hispanic festivals.

FCSE Theme 3 Unit 5 Pupils will look at sports and opinions about them. This builds on language seen in the leisure topic. Similarly food and healthy eating, bad habits and opinion develop work seen in Food and drink. Pupils will also study illness and symptoms as well as exams and how to reduce stress



Catch up- portfolio work

Time in lessons is allocated to ensure that all year 8 pupils are up to date with their portfolio exams. Everyone should enter year 9 with an complete portfolio. This can also be used as an opportunity to extend work and improve marks.

Theme 4 Unit 7 We will look and describing town and geographical areas, whilst giving out opinions. Students will also look at transport and ways to help the environment. As well as home town we will also study the home and build simple descriptions of a house including description of household chores and routine to add detail.

Holidays and Travel

FCSE Theme 2 Unit 3 Pupils will look at travel and transport, including finding the way, getting around and the pros and cons of different transport. Holiday preferences, past holidays and future holidays will be looked at and include destinations, holiday type, accommodation (including describing a hotel), holiday activities and weather.



Education and Future Plans

FCSE Theme 1 Unit 2 Pupils look at describing school, transport to school, timetables, teachers, uniform, rules and plans for future studies and careers. Throughout pupils will continue to expand giving opinions. Pupils will also look at jobs including future aspirations, positives and negatives of certain jobs and personal qualities related to job suitability.



Relationships, Family and Friends

FCSE Theme 1 Unit 1

Pupils will learn language basics including greetings and alphabet. They will share basic greetings and simple information about themselves and others (physical and character description). Students will discuss relationships with family and friends.

FCSE Theme 2 Unit 4 Leisure

Pupils will learn to describe their free time including free time activities, hobbies, computers, giving likes/dislikes and opinions. They will also give opinions about TV, film and music. Additionally pupils will focus on shopping for clothes and understand information around adverts, notices and special offers; clothes - asking re. size, colour, price, style, opinion, payment.

FCSE Theme 3 Unit 6 Food and Drink

Pupils will look at a range of language relating to food and drink including, types of food, menus, recipes. eating Out; Cafés, restaurants, ordering, menus, meals, adverts, restaurant reviews. They will start to look at unhealthy and healthy eating habits and expand their giving opinions to include food and healthy lifestyles. Pupils will also look at shopping for food in Spanish and consider quantities, prices, shopping lists, types of shop, buying fruit/vegetables from markets.
