<u>Term 1</u> 1 week = 2 hours	Relationships with family and friends Talking about yourself (name, age, date of birth, nationality, town/city, pets,) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Key vocabulary on introducing yourself e.g. alphabet, numbers, months, nationalities • Present tense • Adjective agreement (nationalities)
2 weeks = 4 hours	Talking about your physical appearance, personality <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Key vocabulary on physical description & personal characteristics • Present tense • Adjective agreement (personal characteristics) • quantifiers
3 weeks = 6 hours	Talking about your family and relationships <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Key vocabulary on family • Describing people – physical and personality • Describing how well you get on with family • Present tense • Mon, ma, mes • Adjective agreement • Reflexive verbs (present tense)
<u>Reasons behind order of topic in this half term</u>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pupils continue to build their knowledge and be able to communicate about themselves in the target language. • Scaffolding – Each topic builds on the previous • Opportunity to revisit key grammatical structures and skills. • Bridging to GCSE topics, revisiting the basics of each topic and moving forward to cover higher level vocab and structure. These topics are familiar to the pupils from Y7 work which was reinforced in Y8. This is an excellent transition topic as pupils start to develop linguistic range at a higher level than Y7 and Y8. • Grammar concentrates on the present tense and then revises past tenses in personal descriptions as well as present tense.

These topics are familiar to the pupils from Y7 work which was reinforced in Y8. This is an excellent transition topic as pupils start to develop linguistic range at a higher level than Y7 and Y8. • Opportunity to develop the third tense (future), having revised present and past.

<p>2 weeks = 4 hours</p>	<p><u>Identity and Culture</u></p> <p>Customs and festivals in French-speaking countries/ communities</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Knowing vocabulary of local and national traditions and festivals • Describing such festivals and traditions • Expressing and justifying opinions about these matters. • Talk about festivals, celebrations and memorable events in France e.g. Bastille Day • Describing a past event / festival with opinions • Perfect tense rules – regular and common irregular past participles (été, eu, vu, pu, bu, lu) • reflexive verbs in perfect and imperfect tenses together describing a past event / festival; actions and opinions

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pupils continue to build their knowledge and be able to communicate about themselves in the target language. • Scaffolding – Each topic builds on the previous • Opportunity to revisit key grammatical structures and skills. • Bridging to GCSE topics, revisiting the basics of each topic and moving forward to cover higher level vocab and structure. • Media / technology develops from the previous topic of free time activity as many young people spend much free time on new technologies. • Identity and culture follows well from the free time activity, highlighting cultural traditions and free time activities from the foreign country studied.
