Respect and Routines

Thank you for your continued support in ensuring that your children are adhering to our uniform and behaviour standards. Moving forward we will be focusing on attendance and punctuality and reminding students about the importance of good manners and respect towards all members of our community. Year 11 Mock exams and parent support evening

County Lines Awareness Week

Northumbria Police have dedicated this week to raising awareness about 'County Lines'. County Lines is a term used to describe gangs and organised criminal networks involved in exporting illegal drugs into one or more importing areas within the UK, using dedicated mobile phone lines or other forms of "deal line". This is a major threat to children and vulnerable young adults as they are being used to move and store drugs and money. County Lines is happening everywhere and parents and carers need to be aware of the signs in case a young person is being exploited.
