

REPORT- All incidents should be reported - particularly low level or first offences, it helps to build a picture. Speak to your Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) for further advice or guidance and record any actions taken inline with your school safeguarding policy

The safety of our students is paramount. We have introduced a colour-coded lanyard system this term. All permanent staff wear **green** lanyards. Temporary staff and regular visitors who are DBS checked wear **yellow** lanyards. **Red** lanyards are for visitors who are not DBS checked and must be supervised at all times on the school site.

Amazing Art Alumni

Over Easter we received news of a past Fine Art GCSE and A Level student, Sarah Knight, being selected as part of a team to travel with international artist Alberta Whittle to the Venice Biennale. Whittle's work has been selected to represent Scotland at the biennale. This is one of the world's largest Art celebrations and happens across the city of Venice. Sarah is working as an invigilator on an internship linked to the gallery space Whittle's work will occupy. She will be welcoming people into the space, talking them through the artworks on display and answering any questions they may have about the work.

Sarah said, "This opportunity will allow me to expand and engage my artistic knowledge, providing invaluable experience as both an art history student and part-time practising artist. I am also excited to be working with Alberta further, as she places her trust in us to be her representatives when presenting and discussing her works which portray such socially relevant though simultaneously such personal messages. Experiencing Venice in this context will really be a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity, one that I am sure will benefit both my studies and my future."

Sarah has received a lot of training in advance of the exhibition and she intends to travel out to Italy a little earlier in order to soak up some of its amazing Art heritage.

This is a fantastic opportunity and one which Sarah has linked and credited her Art experience and practice at St. Anthony's too. Without which she may not have pursued such amazing creative avenues. We wish Sarah and indeed Alberta Whittle and the Scottish team well over the duration of the exhibition!
