This building is called Westburn or as you get to know St Anthony's better, many refer to it as reception.


This is where pupils go to be collected for medical appointments or will be looked after by first aiders if they are unwell.

It is open from 8am for pupils to grab a hot chocolate, bacon sandwich or croissant before the day starts! It is also open at break time for a snack. 

Science Laboratory



Form Classes and Houses

There are 4 Houses at St Anthony's:

Thomas

Lourdes

De Salles

Gabriel

Each House is made up of form classes from Y7-11.

So you will be in a form class with other Y7 students but your House will be with all year groups.

You will have a form tutor who will look after you daily in registration and form time.

You will have a Head of House and Assistant Head of House too.

There are approximately 30 pupils in a form class. You will have some lessons with this class: art, music, technology, CIAG, PE.



Form classes

Mrs McGann (Transition Co-Ordinator) works with your Y6 class teachers to try to place you with at least 1 friend from your school or someone you may know from another school.

If you are coming from your primary school on your own, you will be placed with other students who are in the same position, so you know you aren't the only one.



Form Tutors

You will find out who your form tutor is when you come to St Anthony's for the Transition Days on Tuesday 25th June – Thursday 27th June.

Your form tutor is the first person you go to if you have a problem or a question about something (e.g.

homework, friendships, medical appointments)

You see them twice a day – during morning registration (8.30-8.50) and form time (11.00-11.30)

Worried about homework?



You will be studying many subjects and so will get more homework. Being in secondary school is a time for you to become more **independent** and **organised**!

You will be given a planner on the first day in September – your form tutors will teach you how to use it effectively and will help you whenever you need it.

We also have a homework club for Y7 on a lunchtime to help you keep organised!

Catholic Life



Our faith is a very important part of life at St Anthony's.

- We pray every morning and afternoon as a year group, in form class and during lessons. You will even learn to pray in French or Spanish!
- Every Friday we celebrate mass which every form class is invited to attend.
- We also have Chapel time when form classes are invited into the chapel to lead their own prayers.
- If you are not Catholic, you do not need to worry, you are welcome to learn the prayers over time and join in.
- If you have a faith already and prefer to opt out of praying, we just ask that you show respect during prayer time.
- We are very privileged to have Ms. Szczepanska as our Academy Chaplain.

She looks after students who need extra support and works in the Haven. This is a place where students can go if they need any extra help, support or someone to talk to




Mrs Perret – HLTA/ Medical Officer

Uniform

- 1. Blazer designated St. Anthony's blazer (navy with green braid and school crest).
- 2. Jumper designated St. Anthony's jumper (navy with green braid and school crest).
- 3. Blouse white, long sleeved, loose fitting, open necked blouse with revere collar.
- 4. Skirt navy designated St. Anthony's skirt (length: on the knee, just above the knee or below the knee).
- 5. Tights navy, plain, opaque tights.
- 6. Shoes black, flat "school" shoes. N.B. no sandals, sling backs, heels, mules, canvas shoes etc. Black boots may be worn during severe winter weather.
- 7. Scarf designated St. Anthony's scarf or plain navy scarf.
- 8. Coat navy or black, no logos, worn over blazer.
- 9. Head Wear navy scarf or hijab available from The Uniform Shop in Sunderland
- 10. PE Kit With St Anthony's school crest. PE kit is compulsory and available from Total Sport, Tel: 0191 5679043 Navy T-shirt, polo shirt Navy shorts Navy tracksuit bottoms Navy hooded top Navy socks Cross trainers.. PE Kit Order Form (Total Sport).pdf
- 11. N.B. leisure trainers and plimsoles are not suitable. Trainers don't have to be navy or black!
- 11. Gym bag
- 12. Plain black/navy school bag/backpack. Big enough to carry everything!



Equipment

At secondary school you have to be organised and more independent.

You will be given some equipment from your teachers (exercise books, folders, textbooks) but there is some equipment you need to bring every day.

Equipment to bring every day:

- Pencil case (any colour, it doesn't have to be black or navy!)
- Black/blue pens, green pen, pencils, ruler, rubber, pencil sharpener.
- Reading book
- Planner and timetable (you will receive these on your first day)
- Plain black/navy school bag
- Correct uniform
- PE (on days you have PE or a sports club)



School Rules



In September you will be given a Planner. Inside the planner there are a few lists of rules parent/carer must sign to say you agree to follow the school rules.

- Wear the correct uniform.
- Be prepared to learn have the right equipment, PE kit, homework and attitude.
- Bring planner to every lesson. The planner should be signed on a weekly basis by their tutor and parent/carer.
- Be respectful to all staff, students and the school building.
- No chewing gum or eating in class.
- Only water allowed in class no fizzy drinks.
- Arrive to the Academy on time and go to the Y7 yard or canteen. If it is raining, go to your bad weather area.
- There is lots of time at break and lunch hour for pupils to use the toilets, the class teacher will allow a child to leave the lesson in an emergency or if they have a toilet pass from Mrs Perrett.

Y7 have their own toilets during break and lunch.

ARE THESE RULES VERY DIFFERENT TO YOUR SCHOOL NOW?

Mobile Phones and Social Media

Mobile phones must be **turned off** and **not taken out of bag** until you have left the school grounds. Teachers who see you with a phone have the right to confiscate it from you and you must go to reception at 3.00pm to collect it or a person from home may have to come to collect it.

We are trusting you to follow this simple rule, there are serious consequences when phones are used on site.

Social Media is also a growing problem in school as students are getting to know each other in school, they very often get to know each other online too. We work hard to educate the students on safe and sensible social media use. Here is some advice for parents – working together is key to safe and positive internet use. Common Questions

WHAT TIME DO I ARRIVE?

- The school day starts at 8.30am (everyone in form class). You must be in school before then to be on time for registration.
- School is open from 8am the gates are locked at 8.30am and the Senior Leadership Team monitor who is arriving at 8.30am.
- If you are very late, go to the top gate on Thornhill Terrace, press the buzzer on the black gate and go to reception to sign in.



Common Questions

WHERE DO I GO WHEN I GET THERE?

There will be staff and students at the gates waiting for you to arrive on your first week in September and on the Transition Days in June.



They will guide you to the Y7 yard.

Common Questions

WHAT TIME DOES SCHOOL FINISH?

The school day ends at 3.00pm.

We recommend you do not get collected by car on Thornhill Terrace as it is extremely busy. We recommend parking in the streets nearby.



Common Questions

WHAT IF I GET LOST?

Don't worry about getting lost, to be honest it is very likely that you will! There will always be a teacher or another pupil who is willing to help!



Common Questions

WHAT IF I'M NOT CATHOLIC?

Do not worry about not being Catholic or if you have a different faith. We ask that you either join in the prayers or simply be respectful as we worship.



Common Questions

WHAT IF I FORGET SOMETHING?

Share any worries you have with your form tutor during form time (11-11.30am) and they can solve the problem for you!



Common Questions

AM I ALLOWED TO BRING A MOBILE PHONE?

Yes, pupils are allowed to bring their mobile phones, but we recommend you only bring it if you really need to use it for travelling to and from school. It will be your responsibility to look after it – it **must be switched off** as soon as you enter the school gates and it cannot be used/looked at throughout the day. Any pupil found breaking this trust will have their **phone** confiscated, detention given, will be placed on report to monitor this behaviour or excluded from school. We are trusting pupils to be mature and responsible, and we take it very **seriously** when this trust is broken!



Common Questions

WHAT IF I NEED TO CONTACT HOME DURING THE SCHOOL DAY?

This will probably be very rare – it may be because you have forgotten to bring your PE kit or you have forgotten dinner money for example.

You must **NEVER use your phone to contact home**. If we discover you have done this there will be consequences.

Whatever the issue is, always talk to your form tutor first as they will be able to solve the problem!



Top Tips from our Y7s...

Don't worry about getting lost, the school isn't as big as it first seems. You will get used to it very quickly and everyone is willing to help!

Be confident to be yourself. Treat everyday as a new opportunity to make friends.


Get to know the people that you sit next to and don't be shy! It'll be great!
