SAFETY ON THE METRO/TRAIN LINES

A message from the Tyne and Wear Metro:

Would it be possible if you could mention to your students about staying safe whilst on their summer holidays as they use the Tyne and Wear Metro? We want them to feel safe and to stay safe and beware of the dangers that surround the railway including level crossings.

While it is not suggested that children attending your school are taking risks or committing crime on the railway, unfortunately, what may seem like harmless fun is in fact very serious and the reality is the risk from the overhead line which has 1,500 DC volts of electricity. Metro trains traveling at speeds of up to 50mph and mainline trains much faster - and a train cannot swerve to miss someone in its path.

Network rail has recently launched its 'Distracted. You've Crossed the Line' safety campaign showing how easily we can become distracted either chatting to friends or listening to music. It is easily to enter a level crossing when we are not paying full attention. Please follow the link below for more information:

VAPING

We have noticed an increase in the number of young people vaping. Vaping is a tool that can be used for adults to give up smoking. It is less harmful than smoking but it is still very dangerous, especially for young people, whose lungs have not yet fully developed. Please talk to your children about the dangers of vaping. In 2020/21, there were over 24,800 child abuse offences recorded by the police in England and Wales

MENTAL HEALTH NEWS IN SCHOOL:

Mrs Moran and Mrs Richardson-Dunn have provided training to our Mental Health Leadership Group this half term. The pupils have completed Mental Health First Aid training, so they will be able to go out and support our pupils in school, particularly our new year 7's.

Mrs Richardson-Dunn also ran some workshops for the year 6 pupils during transition week. As well as trying to minimise the worries of our new students starting St Anthony's in September, we also looked at the theme of 'being kind' to our new friends and trying to include anyone who seemed to be on their own.

During the Summer holidays, it is easy for young people to get out of a routine. Whilst it is important to relax, it is also important for young people to get out and about with friends and not spend too many hours on social media. Social media is a useful tool but can become addictive for young people. Please encourage your children to have time away from their phones/tablets/gaming consoles and get involved in social activities.

Safeguarding Updates

E-scooters, EAPCs, E-bikes, and Motorcycles

Information for parents & carers



**NORTHUMBRIA
POLICE**

Road safety law is there to protect riders and other road users. In the event of a collision, the physical consequences can be devastating, life-changing and can ultimately result in the loss of life. Make sure that when your children ride on the roads they are doing so legally and safely with protective equipment such as helmets. Visit [THINK! What does the law say?

E-scooters

NOT ROAD LEGAL
for ANYONE to use

It is illegal for ANYONE to ride a private e-scooter on public land – roads, pavements and cycle paths included. In law, they are treated as motor vehicles and, because they have no number plate, often don't have rear lights or signalling ability, **they cannot be used legally in public.**

EAPC

(electrically-assisted pedal cycle)

ROAD LEGAL
for those aged 14 and over. Helmet use is advised but optional

An EAPC must have pedals meaning that the bike can be used with or without the motor, and the fitted motor must cut off at a top speed of 15.5 mph (the speed of an average pedal cyclist)

Electronically powered motorcycle – "E-bike"

Whether or not these are road legal depends on certain conditions (see below)

To be road legal an E-bike must have:

- A number plate
- Brake lights
- Indicators

An E-bike without these is NOT ROAD LEGAL.

Also, the rider is subject to the same licence requirements as those for a moped/scooter/motorcycle (see column to the right), and they must have insurance.

Mopeds, scooters and motorcycles

ROAD LEGAL
for those aged 16 and over with a motorcycle licence. Helmet use is mandatory

A provisional driving licence is required and compulsory basic training (CBT) must be completed. The age limit will depend on the type of motorcycle – [visit this link for details](#)

What's the difference between a moped and a scooter? Basically, it's all about engine size, but [read more about it here](#)

Why are rented e-scooters road-legal?

- Renters must have at least a provisional driving licence which has [category Q or P/M entitlement](#)
- The rental company provides insurance for the rider as part of the rental agreement
- They must be ridden in approved areas and only on the road

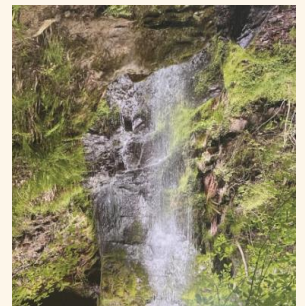
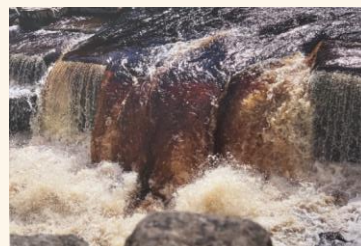
Katherine Puddy Y10 & Yvie Hedley Y9

House Captain KS3 Kaitlyn Graham

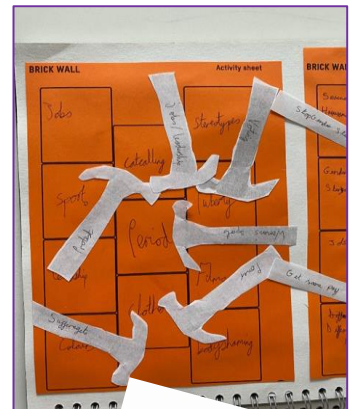

Sophie Mosley, Hannah Webster and Annmaria Varghese have completed their Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award! Congratulations!

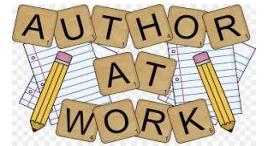




English

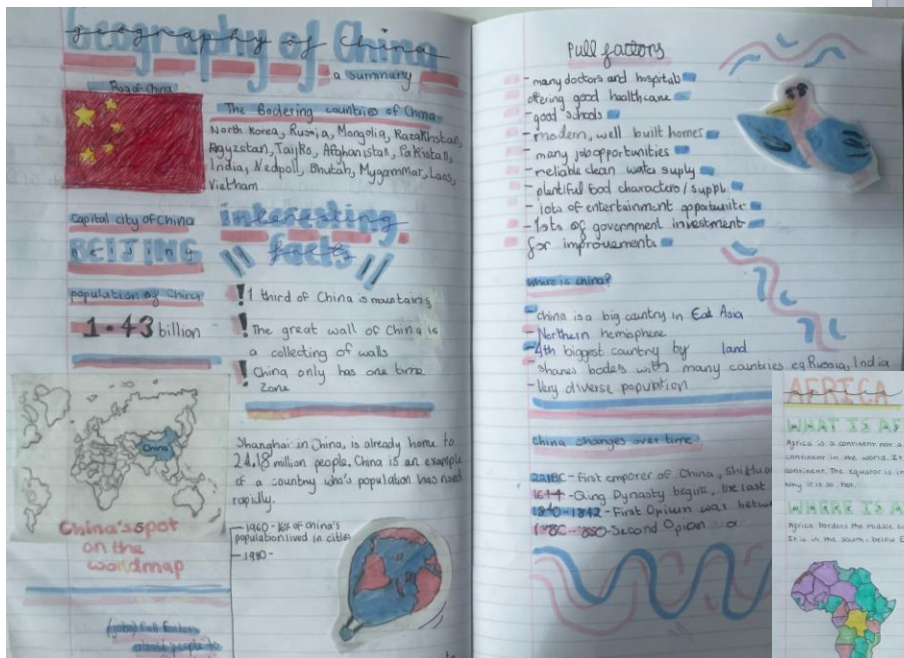
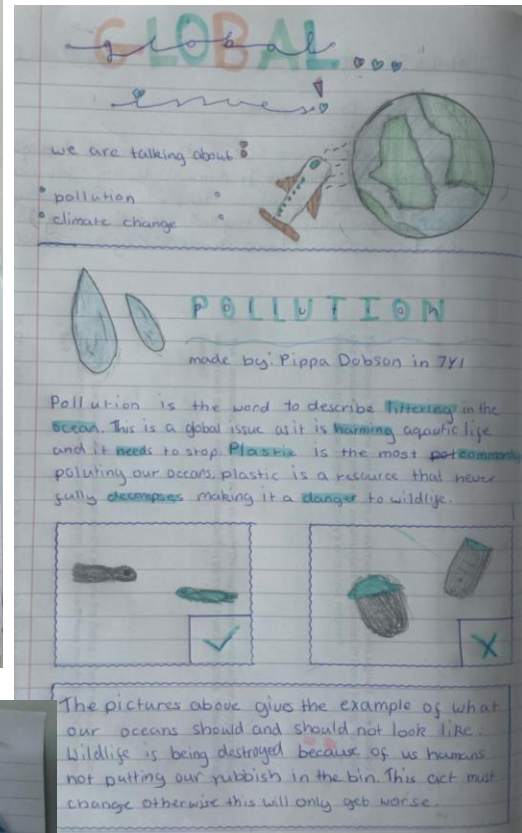
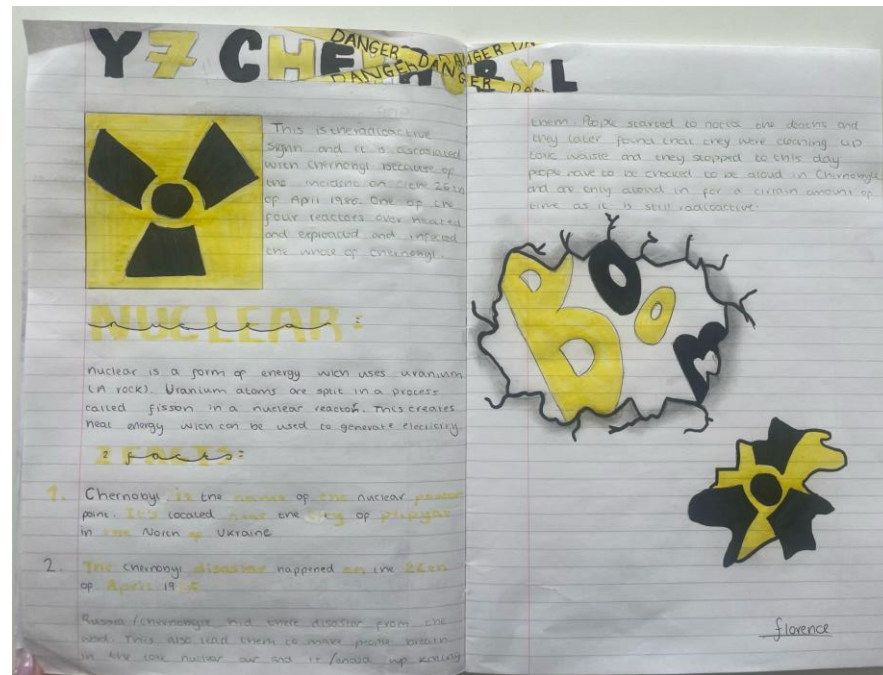
I cannot praise them enough; we were also very lucky that the British summer weather stayed fine for us.

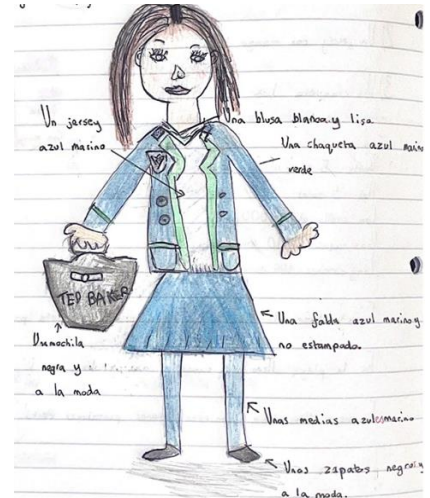
We have been extremely impressed with our MFL students and how hard they have worked this year. Below are some examples of the fantastic work produced in Spanish and French lessons!

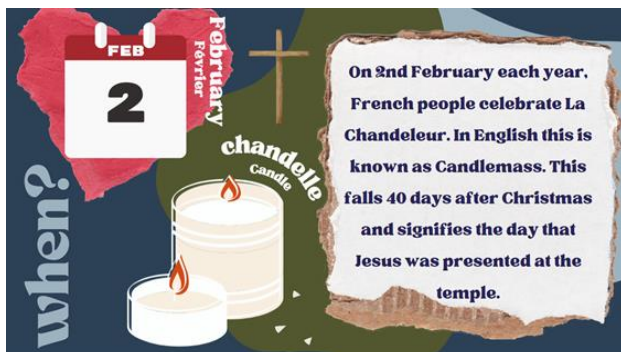

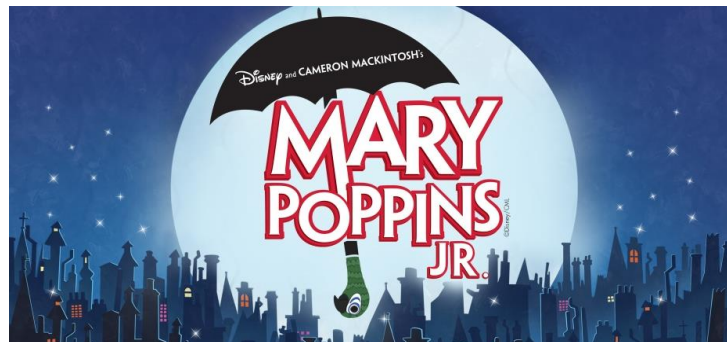


Music Examinations

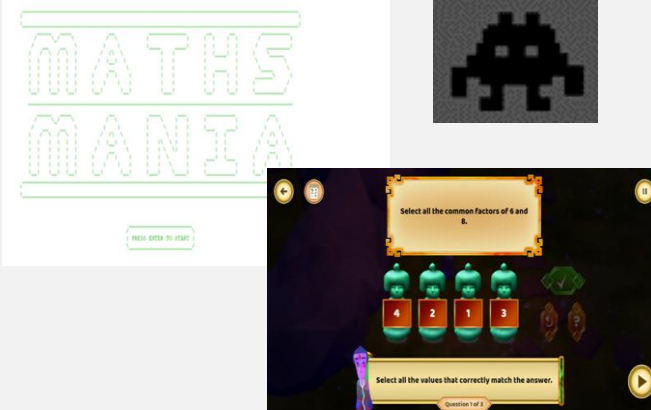

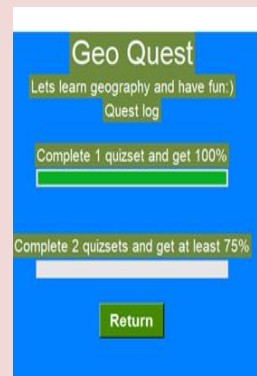

Pupils enjoyed a fabulous visit to Vantec this week. The staff focused on female careers within this fast-growing local industry.

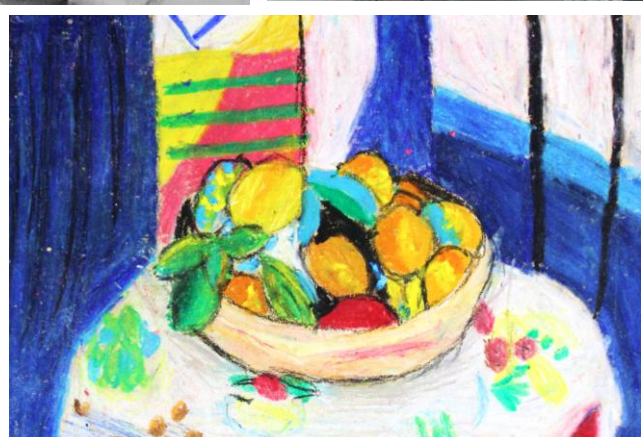
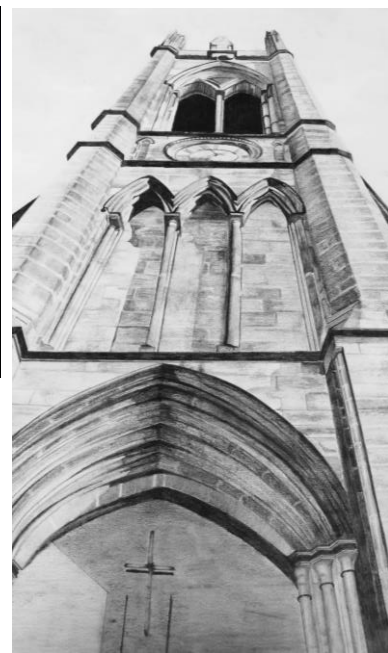
Pupils looked at immersive training for Health and Safety, driving a forklift truck, data analysis and Just in time manufacturing.

Applied Law



Year 12 Law students have attended Sunderland Magistrates Court to develop their understanding of our legal system and to see much of the theory we have studied in action.

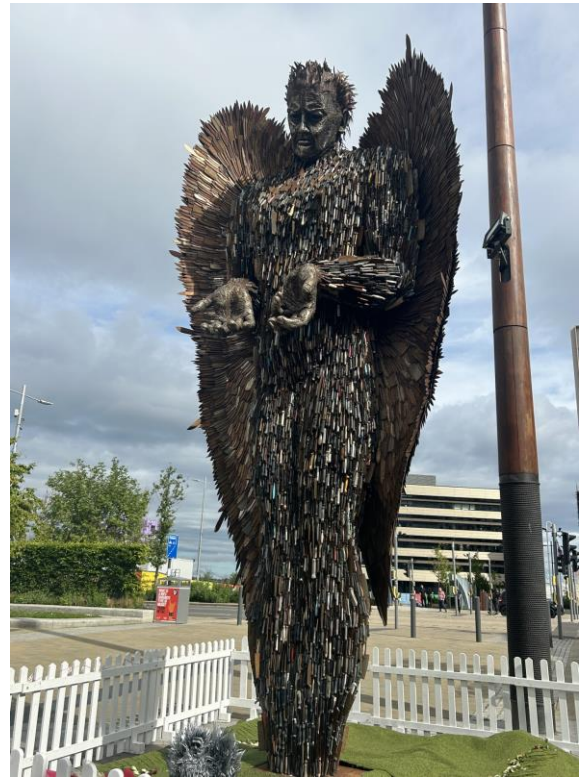
Students sat in the public gallery of the Criminal Court, they witnessed theft cases, careless driving cases, driving under the influence, being in possession of prohibited items, breaking a suspension order, and assault of an emergency worker (Police Officer.)

They have seen first-hand how the prosecution and defence present their case and how they can question and cross-examine witnesses. In addition, they observed how legal aid impacts a trial, as one defendant had her application rejected and so she had no legal representation.



Applied Law

Staff very kindly gave students a tour of the County Court (Civil Court) so they were able to make a comparison with the criminal court. They were also able to see in the criminal court room what the old defendant dock looked like, the cell below, and where this connected to the old police station.



Finally, some students had the chance to speak to a barrister who was in the second half of her pupillage, and she gave them valuable advice in relation to university and training. They were also able to question the Lay Magistrates. Students attended in small groups so as to minimise disruption. The knife angel was on display during some of our visits, and so we had a discussion around its purpose and importance. Students are to be commended for their behaviour during these visits, they were very mature and a credit to the school. The staff in the court were very impressed!

Activities Week

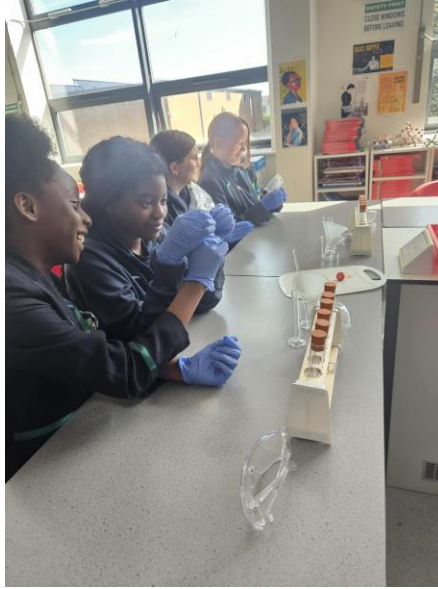

Alumni - Hannah Trotter



Whilst at St Anthony's Catholic Academy I studied History, Music and Textiles for A Levels. I really enjoyed each subject and had some fantastic teachers who really pushed me to my full potential. I was involved in extra-curricular activities within the music department, which involved the musicals, choir and orchestra where I played the alto saxophone. I have very fond memories of my time at St Anthony's, especially playing Fagin in my last musical, 'Oliver'. This was the most fantastic send-off where I was able to express myself and get into character, and to this day, my friends and family still talk about the show!

I went on to study at Sunderland University where I studied BSc Psychology then went on to pursue my MSc in Psychological Research Methods. I enjoyed comparing nature to urban space place preferences, looking into an individual's relationship and emotional attachments to the selection of environments. I was able to combine a significant amount of literature, looking at alternate studies, to present different methodologies and theories to help Dr Stephanie Wilkie design her new study. I was involved in conducting the study and recruiting participants from the University to gather data. This experience was invaluable, I gained so many skills and knowledge from being involved in this process. The time and effort spent on this study, resulted in the findings being published with my name on the paper as co-author. The study was so extensive that a second study was designed and published. I am extremely proud of this achievement, hard work and collaboration really does pay off!

Since University I signed up to an agency as a Teaching Assistant. I worked in primary and secondary SEN schools, helping children with behavioural issues, mental health and learning, and physical disabilities. I definitely gained confidence as a teaching assistant as I had to adapt to different situations for kids of all abilities. I also lectured A Level Psychology students for the day at St Anthony's Catholic Academy which was a great experience. I then managed to successfully get a position with Northumbria Police as a Data Analyst and Research Assistant in the Public Insight Team within Corporate Development. My role was so valuable as I was able to upskill in Excel by preparing the data for the victim satisfaction surveys for a variety of crime types and public perception surveys to better understand their feelings about crime and policing. I conducted phone surveys and then analysed the results to produce data and reports for senior management. I was able to support the quantitative data with the qualitative data as I was able to incorporate the victims own personal experiences into results. Improving victim satisfaction is hugely important to Northumbria Police. I was in this role for 2.5 years and was then successfully promoted to the Performance Team as a Performance Review Adviser. In this role I produce reports for different aspects of Safeguarding, Harm Reduction and Prevention and Deterrence. I now have ownership of certain business areas and lead meetings giving updates on performance, which supports the improvement and development of the Performance Management framework for the force. I use my problem-solving skills to quality check all the data, so I'm confident in what I produce for internal and external partners.

My advice to current students would be that no matter what difficulties you come across in your professional life, embrace opportunities even if the route you take is different to what you had initially planned. Things always work out in the end. If you are confident in your abilities, speak up for things that matter and set goals and aims, you will be extremely successful in life!
